7.1 <u>Action Items List</u>

Deputy Mayor Baryluk inquired about the anticipated cost of bringing a car crusher in to deal with derelict vehicles in town and possibly the region. SAO Hood stated that no costs have been determined and that several SAOs had discussed the possiblity of pooling resources to bring up a crusher. He further stated that the Town would not be open to accepting vehicles into our landfill and would rather send them south. Councillor Wainman stated that he thought it was a good idea and that he would like to see the work tendered and the vehicles sent south for recycling.

Councillor Wainman noted that the brush needs to be cut back along parts of the Boot Lake Trail for safety reasons.

8.1 <u>Indigenous Disabilities Awareness Month Proclamation</u>

"WHEREAS the Town of Inuvik is committed to creating an accessible and inclusive community;

AND WHEREAS 68% of the population of Inuvik is Indigenous peoples;

AND WHEREAS the rate of disability within the Indigenous population is conservatively estimated at 31%, at least two-times higher than that of the non-Indigenous population;

AND WHEREAS Indigenous peoples living with disabilities in our community face unique challenges as a marginalized population within a marginalized population;

AND WHEREAS Indigenous peoples in our community disproportionately face complex life barriers, from a legacy of colonialism that can cause disability, including: poverty, food insecurity, homelessness, victimization, trauma, and lack of resources;

AND WHEREAS disability services often rely on medical understandings of disability that undermine Indigenous community knowledge and experiences;

AND WHEREAS Indigenous peoples living with disabilities are resilient and make important contributions to our community that must be honored;

NOW THEREFORE, I, Jim McDonald, Mayor of the Town of Inuvik, by the power vested in me, do hereby proclaim November, 2018 as Indigenous Disabilities Month in the Town of Inuvik;

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of the Town of Inuvik to be affixed this 24th day of October, 2018."
